What we achieved



Facilitated co-design project materials and methods

 - Structured teaching
 - Early Years behaviour support program
 - School connectedness
- Advised on cultural considerations when developing resources and constructing the Autism Teen Wellbeing website autismteenwellbeing.com.au
- Involved in the provision of creative and alternative programs to promote student equity, diversity, inclusive learning and parent and community engagement embedded in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and multicultural educational initiatives
- Established connections and collaborations with key stakeholders including:
 - Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander team at Positive Partnerships
 - Community organisations at Queensland University of Technology (QUT)
- Established a communicative network to discuss cultural issues and access of information relative to Indigenous engagement.



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What we achieved



Translated knowledge with the community

Worked with communities in the development of training, the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Community Liaison Research Assistant:

- collaborated with communities, research project leaders and Autism CRC School Years Program Director to develop culturally sensitive resources
- played a lead role in the Faculty of Education, QUT Indigenous Vacation Research Experience Scheme (IndigiVRES) program
- supervised two IndigiVRES students
- · received an Equity award for:
 - launching the Faculty of Education IndigiVRES in 2017
 - the successful development and management of this scheme with exceptional outcomes
 - for successfully encouraging Indigenous students to engage in research with confidence and promoting a future research pathway for the student
- supported Indigenous students to:
 - collaborate with external partners
 - develop classroom educational resource publications
 - analyse data, share findings and engage in a robust, engaging and a trustworthy partnership between schools and the research team.
