How we did the research

A series of surveys with participants, and a survey and interviews with organisations.



Who took part?







What did we find?

All participants completing the first survey indicated the workshop was 'good' (18%) or 'excellent' (82%). All Future Leaders participants that completed the second program survey rated the program as 'excellent' and all would recommend it to others.

At one year follow up, the majority of participants completing the survey indicated the areas that they have been involved in for the first time, or increased involvement in, as:

public speaking or delivering training



71%

being part of a board, committee or reference group



54%

working with or giving advice to government or community organisations

writing blogs or media articles.
